The Fort McDowell Yavapai Nation will be hosting its 9th Annual Invitational Indian Market on March 16, 17 & 18, 2012. This event is co-sponsored by the Fort McDowell Radisson Resort and Casino, featuring an art show, food venue, demonstrators, live entertainment, and raffles.

The show is open to Native American artists in jewelry, weavings, sculptures, pottery, paintings, wood carvings/sculptures, fetishes, clothing, photography, tribal arts and crafts, etc. Fine (authentic) arts and crafts are emphasized for this show.

Booth Fee: The fee for participating in this event is \$165.00.

Special Booth Fee of \$85.00 for Seniors 60 years and older. (Proof of age)

In order to effectively advertise the event, **please return the contract with booth fee by February 24, 2012. A late fee of \$50.00 will be assessed after February 24th.**

The 9th Annual Invitational Indian Market is a memorial event on behalf of well known Hopi father/son artists, Lawrence and Wilmer Saufkie. They were both colleagues to many of you in the art world and tragically left this world last June. A portion of the show proceeds will go toward establishing an art scholarship program on behalf of Lawrence and Wilmer Saufkie.

Mr. Upton S. Ethelbah, Jr., (Greyshoes) - Santa Clara Pueblo & White Mountain Apache, renowned artist in stone & bronze sculptors is one of the featured artist for the event. Mr. Dominic Arquero (Cochiti Pueblo) is the Master of Ceremonies. The show will feature several demonstrators as well.

A special business seminar by Quannie Accounting Services LLC will be held on Friday evening, March 16th at the Radisson Resort. The free seminar for artists is sponsored by Emerson Horace III in the area of financial, customer, inventory/vendor, security and multi-user management. RULES & REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO ART SHOW

Regulations: Participating artists must be in compliance with the Indian Arts and Crafts acts of 1990, truth in-advertising law that protects the customers, artists, craftspeople, Tribes, etc.

Originality: All work displayed must be designed and created by the artist or family member

Artifacts & Ceremonial Objects: Absolutely no sale or display of prehistoric or culturally sensitive artifacts. Display or sale of ceremonial objects is strictly prohibited.

Pottery: Hand coiled or wheel thrown are preferred. Contemporary pottery forms, kiln fired and made or decorated with commercial materials are acceptable and must be properly identified.

Jewelry: Only handmade jewelry may be sold. Natural turquoise does not need special labeling. Stabilized turquoise must be properly labeled. No block (turquoise/epoxy resins and dye) fake turquoise, imitation stones, synthetic opal, machine made components (except findings) can be used. Also, not allowed are non-American Indian made heishi, stamped fetishes, nickel silver, and liquid silver or plated metals. **Grand Canyon jewelry strictly prohibited.**

Paintings & Drawings: Paintings, drawings and graphics must be matted, framed or shrink wrapped. Paintings on canvas should be framed for its protection.

Prints: No xerographic-typed mechanical reproductions, laser prints or photographs of original art work are allowed. Limited edition prints, signed and numbered may not exceed 750.

Weavings & Textiles: Rugs, blankets, belts and purses must be handmade. All natural yarns

and dyes are acceptable. Synthetic or acrylic yarn must be properly labeled. Sewing machine work is acceptable. No commercially made clothing, liquid embroidery or products made from kits are allowed.

Dolls: Dolls in traditional categories must use materials historically associated with its native culture. Artists are not to display dolls of tribes other than their own tribal affiliation.

Pets Prohibited: No pets allowed on the Market grounds, except for seeing eye dogs assisting visually handicapped persons.

Security & Waiver: Artists are responsible for their art and booth during the Market. Security will be provided on Friday and Saturday nights from 5pm to 6am. SWNAP, Fort McDowell Yavapai Nation, Fort McDowell Casino and Radisson Resort, its employees or volunteers are not responsible for loss, damage, vandalism, casualty, injury or theft.

Booth Information: 10' x 10' booth space. Artist must provide canopy, tables, chairs, etc.

Check In & Set Up: Friday, March 16, 1pm to 6pm; Saturday, March 17, 7am to 9am.

(Driving into show area to unload is permitted. Vehicles must be out by 8:30am Saturday)

(Driving into show area to load on Sunday is not permitted until after 5pm)

Show Hours: Saturday, March 17, 9am to 6pm; Sunday, March 18, 10am to 5pm
