3. **Set Up:** Outdoor Pavilion  
March 3, 2006: 5pm to 8pm  
March 4, 2006: 6am to 9am
4. **Show Hours:** Booth must be open from 9am to 5pm on Saturday and Sunday. No early closures and/or removal prior to 5pm on Sunday, March 5, 2006.
5. **Advertising & Publicity:** In order to compete with the annual Heard Indian Market and to draw the public to our event, the art show will be well publicized in the Arizona Republic and East Valley Tribune, radio, television and fliers. **THIS IS WHY IT IS IMPERATIVE FOR YOUR BOOTH FEE TO BE SUBMITTED EARLY TO BE USED FOR EXTENSIVE ADVERTISEMENTS AND TO ASSURE YOU THAT YOUR NAME WILL BE LISED IN THE ADS.
